FRIENDS OF THE CHURCH OF ST MARY MAGDALENE HUNTSHAW

UPDATE AUGUST 2018

The Friends with the support of the PCC have made excellent progress over the past six months having overseen hundreds of people visiting our church. The congregation numbers are steadily growing and we have hosted three successful fundraising events, including a joint event with the Friends of All Saints. More exciting and different events are coming up and already we are thinking about 2019.

CHURCH REPAIRS We have obtained three estimates and it looks as if we need to raise at least £180,000 for repair work. We are at an early stage and this figure may change but we will be able to reclaim VAT on costs. Two major grantfunders have invited us to submit applications and negotiations with a third are underway. Please note that applying for grants is a lengthy and complex process and realistically we may not be ready to start work until 2020.

THE BELLS We want to hear the bells ringing again and Richard (Sears) has met with the Diocese Consultant on Bells and the Bells and Bellfries Advisor to the Guild of Devon Bellringers. The first thing to say is that the bells and bell frames are listed so strict restrictions apply to any restoration. Two of the bells are 'out of tune' while the third is cracked so they would have to be removed through the tower roof and taken away for a month for repair. As the heaviest bell is half a ton this is a major undertaking. Discussions are ongoing, but no decisions made as yet as to whether we go ahead.

CREATING AN OPEN SPACE IN THE CHURCH As you are probably aware, the flooring beneath the four pews at the back of nave needs new joists and the area is currently out of use. The Friends and the PCC are negotiating with the Diocese, that the pews are removed permanently to create an open space for the Sunday School, prayer meetings, discussion groups, coffee mornings etc. The front partition would remain. The question is, if we are successful in our plans, what do we do with the redundant pews?

BAT SURVEY Before any repair work can begin we are required to have a bat survey. We are grateful to the PCC for funding this which began on 22nd July with a site assessment. As expected bats have been found so a twilight survey will now take place. The survey will continue for 12 months.

Open Church Day Sunday, 9^{th} September 12-4 pm In celebration of Devon Historic Churches Day we are opening the doors of the church for visits and or quiet reflection. Barbecue 12-2 pm. Cream teas 2-4 pm. Start the day by coming along to our popular All Age service at 11 am.

Graveyard Survey Monday, 10th September, 11 am Join us for a systematic recording using methods developed by The Historic Graveyard Project team. Each headstone will be numbered, photographed and have its inscription recorded.

Harvest Festival 4th October 2018 from 7pm

Remembrance Sunday 11th November

We will be welcoming congregations from all 11 churches in the Two Rivers Mission for this important event to mark the centenary of the end of WW1. There will



be a ceremonial march of veterans or their families, followed by a service and laying of wreaths. The Tommy silhouettes will be joining us as a reminder of the horrors of war. Refreshments in the village hall from 12 midday.
